

WAITING CHILD SERVICES TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Adoption and parenting come with many challenges (and joys!) and we want to ensure that Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAPs) are well prepared to meet the needs of the child(ren) they welcome into their home. We encourage PAPs to continue their education throughout the adoption process and in the years to come. *PRIDE training must be completed before a Home Study Worker can be assigned to your case.* The remaining training must be completed before the final, in-home visit. At any time while working with our agency, more training may be required to better prepare you.
