Description of Adoption Programs

Home Study Only (HSO) Program – Our agency completes a Home Study (Domestic or International) for Illinois prospective adoptive parents who are working with other placing resources (agencies and/or attorneys). Our agency's HSO Program for International Adoption does not include Primary Provider Services. Any family pursuing International Adoption must identify and retain a Primary Provider to oversee their International Adoption.

Traditional Adoption Placement (TAP) Program – Our agency works with expectant parents (EPs) that have approached the agency to explore the option of developing adoption plans for their children. We assist EPs to find potential placements for their child by sharing profiles of our prospective adoptive parents who may be a good fit. To minimize prospective adoptive parents' financial risk, there are no matching fees, and our agency pays all EP expenses.

Agency-Assisted Placement (AAP) Program – Similar to our TAP program, our agency supports expectant parents (EPs) and prospective adoptive parents throughout the adoption process. With the AAP program, prospective adoptive parents have already identified an EP residing in Illinois who is considering placing a child for adoption. Prospective adoptive parents pay for staff expenses (mileage, time, etc.) and legally allowable EP expenses. These fees are not recoverable if placement does not occur.

Waiting Child Services (WCS) Program – Our agency supports prospective adoptive parents to navigate the various foster care systems throughout the US, including Illinois, by helping them identify and obtain information about children available for adoption. Once matched, our agency will coordinate the process with the agency or sending state.

Primary Provider Services – Our agency may be able to serve as the Primary Provider for your international adoption, in particular for relative or parent-identified adoptions. This service is independent and separate from the international home study service. Family Resource Center (the legal name of Adoption Center of Illinois) has been a Hague-accredited agency since 2008. This accreditation allows us to act as an Accredited Adoption Service Provider (ASP) for international adoptions, both Hague adoptions and non-Hague adoptions.

Hague Outgoing Primary Provider – Family Resource Center (the legal name of Adoption Center of Illinois) is a Hague-accredited agency accredited for Outgoing adoptions. We work with prospective adoptive parents residing in other Hague Convention countries who are interested in pursuing the adoption of a child in the United States, either through our TAP program or when families independently locate US children available for adoption through their own resources.

Family Based Financial Aid – TAP PROGRAM ONLY: Our Board of Directors created the FBFA program to support prospective adoptive parents from a wide range of economic circumstances in pursuing adoption. The FBFA program provides non-cash grants to prospective adoptive parents who demonstrate financial need.

Prospective adoptive parents have the option of applying for FBFA prior to submitting their Phase I fee by submitting a non-refundable \$250 fee. Prospective adoptive parents must otherwise apply for FBFA within 60 days of submitting their application and Phase I fee, with no additional FBFA application fee. If any amount of FBFA is awarded, it will be applied to the Phase III placement fee. At the time of placement, your financial aid grant letter will act as cash towards your payment of the placement fee. *This program is only open to US citizens and US residents. INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY PROVIDER

Phase I

Services:

- Document Review & Consultation
*(\$250 document review fee will be applied to your Phase 1 fee**)*
- Initial Consultation with other adoption service providers, in-country attorneys and/or foreign authorities as needed
- Determination of the viability of providing primary provider services
- Includes an \$815 Monitoring and Oversight fee that agency will pay directly to CEAS, the accrediting entity, for the adoption of ONE child. If more than one child is being adopted, Phase I will include an additional \$1,350 per child (\$815 for each child will be sent directly to CEAS for Monitoring and Oversight).

Fee: \$3,350

Phase II

Services:

- Ongoing communication and/or supervision of home study service provider, foreign supervised providers, foreign attorneys, foreign and US governmental agencies and Central Authorities.
- Review of all documentation required to verify completion of all six-adoption services in order to allow prospective adoptive parents to apply for visa for child's entry to United States. Support and assistance with USCIS and Visa application process.

Fee: \$3,100

This fee applies to families who stop communicating with ACI, those who voluntarily go on hold, as well as families who give birth to a child or adopt independent of ACI home study services. Adoption Center of Illinois at Family Resource Center's (ACI) Refund Policy

Unless otherwise stated below, all fees paid to our agency are non-refundable.

Phase I Fee for Domestic Programs and International Home Study Services

A portion of the Phase I fee may be refundable under the following circumstances:

A] If prospective adoptive parents submit an application to our agency and withdraw¹ it before the initial application interview, all but \$300 of the Phase I fee is refundable. A refund check will be mailed within 60 days of a written request.

B] If prospective adoptive parents submit an application to our agency and withdraw¹ it after the initial application interview, all but \$1,750 of the Phase I fee is refundable. A refund check will be mailed within 60 days of a written request.

C] There shall be no refund of the Phase I fee once the assigned home study worker begins the home study interview process.

TAP Program Phase III Placement Fee

The Placement fee paid by prospective adoptive parents will be fully refunded by ACI in the event the adoptive placement of the child is reversed prior to the finalization of the adoption, due to a successful legal challenge brought by a putative/biological father and the subsequent loss of custody of the child by the prospective adoptive parents. This refund will be made within 60 days after the return of the child to ACI.

Agency-Assisted Placement Program "Expense Fund"

Any remaining funds in prospective adoptive parents' Expenses Fund account will be refunded after a period of 60 days in which there is no account activity.

Primary Provider Program Fees

All fees paid are non-refundable.

Outgoing Primary Provider Program Fees

All fees paid are non-refundable.
